

Thanksgiving Supplement for Little Strummers.


Since this is a supplement packet of music, there is no instruction given. It is meant to supplement the Little Strummers instructional packet, not replace it. The songs are familiar children's tunes with Thanksgiving words.

The chords used in this packet are:




It is fun to substitute a different pick or strum on each verse. It makes it more interesting for the guitar player as well as those who are listening or singing along. As long as the meter is the same, you can replace the pick or strum with a different one. Any 4 beat pick or strum may be replaced with any other 4-beat pick or strum.

The three beat picks and strums that can be used are:



The four beat picks and strums that can be used are:



When you see "/" above the measure, continue to play the pick or strum that was indicated before. Each "/" is one pick or strum.

If you see part of a strum in parenthesis (), this is only played when going from the end of one verse to the beginning of the next. It is not played at the beginning of the song.

When you see [End: $\mathbf{A} \mathbf{\downarrow}$] that means play the indicated chord with a thumb down at the end of the song, not the end of the verse.

If the song is in a difficult range to sing, place a capo on the second or third fret to raise the pitch.
